Bakers aided by moral rearmament

The growth and advance of the ideology of moral re-armament on the African Continent were described by representatives of the movement who spoke at a meeting, convened by the Mayor, Mr. I. E. B. Attwel, of members of the City Council and the heads of major departments yesterday afternoon.

Mr. C. J. Claassen, Q.C., said that three forces were at work in Africa. They were the disorganized materialism of the West, the organized materialism of the East in the shape of Communism, and the inspired ideology of moral re-armament,

"SHOWDOWN" AVERTED

Mr. R. Bennett, general secretary of the Witwatersrand Baking Employees' Association, said that bitter feelings between management and labour in the baking industry had grown to such an extent last December that the stage was set for a "showdown."

He would be the first to admit that moral re-armament had played a large part in starting negotiations which had led to a satisfactory settlement.

Mr. R. P. Erasmus, president of the Mine Workers' Union, said that in the three years that moral re-armament had been known on the Rand labour-management relations had improved 100 per cent.
