## World Assembly in Switzerland

FIFTY-FOUR German indus-trial, political and trade union leaders have arrived by special plane at Caux, Switzerland, after plane at Caux, Switzerland, after travelling from the Ruhr to join the World Assembly for Moral Re-Armament. Among them is Anton Storch, Labour Minister of the German Federal Republic, who is representing the German Chancellor, Dr. K o n r a d

Adenauer.
This information was passed to the Eastern Province Herald yesterday after being received by private cable by Moral Re-Arma-ment representatives temporarily based at Port Elizabeth. It links up with an inference previously drawn by overseas observers that the Schuman Plan for pooling coal and steel production was based on broad ideals propagated by Moral Re-Armament, stated a spokesman for the Movement.

## "ANIMATING FORCE".
