Hon. J. F. T. Naude, of the South African of Assembly, and Mr. Naude tomorrow conclude a five-day visit to the Moral Re-Armament World Assembly here. Before leaving he addressed the 1,400 delegates. "Here at Caux," said Mr. Naude, "I have seen something that changes individuals, changes nations and changes ideologies. I have been thinking of Lake Success. Either we must bring Lake Success to Caux or Caux to Lake Success. Otherwise there will be no success.

"I have visited the house a few hundred yards from here where Paul Kruger died, and was impressed with the tribute paid him this morning by an Englishman from this platform. I have had the opportunity to visit quite a number of countries—Finland, Norway, Sweden, Germany and Switzerland. Wherever one came into contact with people there was that feeling of distress, suspicion, uncertainty and fear. The one place we have come where there is happiness and where one sees hope for the future is here at Caux.
