Apologizing Rugby Players Win Match

GRAAFF - REINET. — Following the visit of an international team of Moral Rearmament to Graaff - Reinet, a remarkable claim has been made by students of the Graaff-Reinet Training College rugby side.

They told me yesterday that they had decided to eliminate chorus singing from the pavilion as it was one-sided, to stop anything suggestive of boisterous rugby and to play the game for the game's sake.

They applied these principles the Saturday before last and registered their first win this season by six points

to three.

Spectators maintain that the rugby was faster and brighter, with fewer penalties. But the student players apologize to their opposing numbers if they bump them.

Moral Rearmament has taken such a hold in Graaff-Reinet that one farmer has given his full accumulated wool profits and wool levy to Moral Rearmament for use in the Eastern Cape.
