## Moral Rearmament

THE sixth annual World Assembly for Moral Rearmament at Caux, Switzerland, ended yesterday.

In the past six years 38,000 representatives from 110 countries have attended the Assemblies, including 450 M.P.s and 100 Cabinet Ministers, 600 delegates from the Far East and 1,300 senior officers from 20 countries.

Even 150 have come from behind the Iron Curtain.

From 12 African countries this year have come 112 Europeans, Indians and Africans.

One of the outstanding features of the Assembly has been the response of convinced Marxists, 1,600 of whom have attended this year.

Among them is Stalin's onetime Commissar for Forestry and member of the Politburo of the U.S.S.R., who received a standing ovation when he said: "Frank Buchman, with his conception of absolute moral standards, has enabled communists who fight the class war to build up, in a new way, the true classless society and a new world".

## FAR EAST

A Moral Rearmament task force has been invited to visit India, Pakistan, Burma, Ceylon and Japan.

A German Cabinet Minister said: "The real peace of Europe was signed here in Caux in 1947".
