Blacks **Dies**

Dr. WILLIAM F. NKOMO, first African President of the South African Institute of Race Relations, died in Pretoria recently. Known as "The Father of all Blacks", Dr. Nkomo was a most outspoken critic of apartheid. He was a staunch believer in the creation of equality within South Africa; and as opposed to Black Power as to White Rule. A man of international stature, he went to Northern Ireland and had talks with Cardinal Conway, Archbishop Simms and the Reverend Ian Paisley, and the leading politicians of North and South.

"I want to see a new Commando Force move throughout the Continent of Africa to fight for our Leaders to become incorruptible, hate the things that divide men, and live out the faith which is vital for the future of my Coninent. There was a time when we wanted to drive the white man into the sea. Now we are fighting for a new type of white man, who will work with us to remake South Africa."
