Caux 75th Anniversary Stories

This year marks the 75th anniversary of the Caux conference centre. One of the initiatives to mark this jubilee is to tell a story for each of the years since 1946 on the Caux web site. Many of them use material from For A New World and link to publications, photos or film clips on our platform.

Since the 1930s, one theme running through the work of the Oxford Group (later Moral Re-Armament and now Initiatives of Change) has been supporting indigenous peoples in their search for justice and recognition.

God's Freedom Fighter



Fearless in spirit, a passionate leader, always ready to meet and talk frankly with anyone, to whatever race, party or camp they might belong – this describes this man of the cloth, Rev Arthur Kanodereka (above left), a nationally-known politician, a husband to his wife, Gladys, of 20 years, father of their six children and a senior minister of the Methodist Church.

During the 'bush war' between the freedom fighters and the white Security Forces leading up to an independent Zimbabwe, Kanodereka actively recruited young 'guerilla' fighters. He suffered with his people. Three times he was

arrested, tortured and interrogated, in fruitless efforts to make him talk. He said, "I became a black nationalist who hated whites like hell."

Kanodereka was invited to an occasion where a fair-haired man was chairing the meeting. The young man began by giving his name, "Alec Smith" (above right). Kanodereka sat up. This was the son of the Prime Minister, Ian Smith, who embodied all he hated. "I have come to realise," Alec said, "that I bear a personal responsibility for my country's dilemma. It was me, Alec Smith, who was answerable, because my selfish lifestyle and insensitive attitudes drove those boys into the bush..... For my part, I am deeply sorry for the selfishness of my past life."

Here was something Kanodereka had never heard before. He was thunderstruck. "I picked up a vision of what could happen. I saw Christ, the suffering Christ, not just for blacks or just for whites, but for all people."

He realized that the hatred he had towards the white people had spilled over on to his family. "You cannot have hatred in one pot and not transfer it to the other pot," he said.

Kanodereka fought a battle between the bridge-builders and the bridge-wreckers. His outspokenness won him a world-wide range of friends who respected and loved him; but it also won him enemies. Their hatred of him and of all he stood for drove them to arrange his murder in December 1978.

Academic Interest

There is considerable academic interest in the history of the Oxford Group, Moral Re-Armament and Initiatives of Change.



We have just published Andrew Dawson's [thesis on Dietrich Bonhoeffer and the Oxford Group](#). Bonhoeffer was a major theologian and a figure in the resistance to Hitler in Germany. This thesis makes fascinating reading, linking Bonhoeffer to Emil Brunner (pictured right with Frank Buchman and Theo Spoerri), another major Swiss theological figure of the period, closely associated with the Oxford Group.

For A New World is a precious resource for academics and researchers. In September, Andrew and Eliane Stallybrass attended the defence of the first of the two doctorates financed by the Swiss National Fund for Scientific Research on the Caux archives. Cyril Michaud received his doctorate, at the University of Lausanne. His title: '« For God's sake, wake up! » (sic, in English) Moral Re-Armament on Swiss soil (1932-1969). An international of believers against the spectre of Communism. Organization, networks and militancy.' 614 pages (including the bibliography and index), with 217 pages of 'annexes', with a database of 3,000 fiches names with biographic material for the Swiss 'teams' of the early years of Caux! In November, the second doctorate, by Audrey Bonvin, will be presented at the University of Fribourg, covering the following years. We hope that all or much of this material will find a home on For A New World.
