

M.P.'S MORAL REARMAMENT STUDY

TOUR OF EUROPE IN PROGRESS

SWITZERLAND, Thursday. — South Africa and the Western nations had to accept responsibility for having created conditions in which Communism flourished, said Mr. H. J. Klopper (H.N.P., Vredefort), speaking yesterday at Caux-Sur-Montreux, at the World Assembly for Moral Rearmament.

Mr. Klopper, who is to tour Western Germany and Holland to study the work of Moral Rearmament, said, "Russia came to the world with an ideology when we had nothing. She claimed the allegiance of millions that we should have had. But we were asleep, content with our luxuries and glories."

In a world of ideologies there was no neutrality. One had to choose to fight and stand or fall by it.

"We still have a great opportunity of offering something better than materialism, but if we want to offer it we have to get a move on," he said.

MANY MISTAKES

"In South Africa we have not been faultless, and have made many mistakes. I shall do my utmost to help my nation follow the ideology of Caux. The best security I can give my family and nation is to fight alongside those who aim to bring this ideology to mankind."

He pledged himself to give three months' service to moral rearmament on his return, and said he intended to improve the housing conditions of his employes.

Mr. J. S. Labuschagne (A.P., Klip River), who is touring Western Germany and Holland with Mr. Klopper, said: "The whole world can take a new course on the basis of the moral standards we find here. Moral rearmament is the force that can show the way to a new day and a new way between nations. I am going to apply it to my own life with my family, to the people who work with me and to my nation."—New World News Service.
