

FREEDOM HAILED AS KENYA FLAG FLIES IN INDIA



THE FIRST Kenya flag to be flown over Indian soil was hoisted by a South African and a Southern Rhodesian before representatives of 30 nations (picture right). A one-hundred voice Moral Re-Armament chorus sang the Kenya National Anthem.

Watching the ceremony (below) were Mr. Niketu Iralu of Nagaland, nephew of the Naga leader, Mr. A. Z. Phizo, and Mr. Leonard Crane of the

Sarcee Indians in Alberta, Canada.

Mr. Rajmohan Gandhi (left), grandson of India's great leader, hailed the Independence of Kenya at the ceremony.

He said: "We expect Kenya to be in the lead in the fight for the political liberation of every last country that remains slave in Africa today. We also expect Kenya to be in the lead in a new kind of revolution against the tyranny of materialism that is gripping every kind of society."
