Harmony possible say visiting students

JOHANNESBURG,

Tuesday.

A group of eight overseas students, who have spent 10 weeks in South Africa and Rhodesia meeting senior Cabinet ministers, business leader and people of all ages have left the country believing that racial harmony can be achieved in Southern Africa.

The group which comprises students from Oxford and Cambridge Universities, England, and others from Sweden, Germany and Belgium, came to South Africa at the invitation of the multiracial Moral Rearmament Movement in South Africa.

"Coming from countries which have their own problems in human relations

we realise that nobody can afford to point fingers", said one of the students, Mr Patrick Colquhoun, a graduate of Oxford.

"It was refreshing to be in a country where the real dangers of communism are known but we also found a brand of anti-communism which is totally counter-productive.
