# 'Let Dag speak with Africans'

**A**N appeal to Mr. Dag Hammarskjold, United Nations General-Secretary, to have discussions with African leaders of all shades of opinion on his nine day visit to the Union has been made by Dr. William F. Nkomo, prominent Moral Rearmament leader of Lady Selborne.

"One hopes that Mr. Hammarskjold will not be asked to receive only those hand-picked leaders whose ideas conform to those of the Government," he said.

"Mr. Hammarskjold should be

free to interview who ever he chooses to."

Dr. Nkomo said that he was expressing his private opinion, and not that of any organisation.

He added that he would like to interview the U. N. Secretary-General himself. Mr. Hammarskjold should know and be told of the complaints of Africans directly.

"We welcome the visit of Mr. Hammarskjold to this country. It is a good thing for a representative of a world

organisation to see for himself what is going on and to have discussions with representatives of all groups."

The U. N. should know the views of all sections of the population. Only then could it arrive at a proper solution.

Dr. Nkomo said there were African leaders who supported apartheid and also those who, like himself, felt that only a shared society could bring peace.

Mr. Hammarskjold is due to arrive in the Union on Thursday.
