THE PRESS

More than 150 Swiss newspapers carried feature articles and special supplements to mark the 10th anniversary. "Neue Zurcher Zeitung", which is carefully studied all over Europe, had a special page headed "Moral Renaissance". Of the decorations Dr. Buchman has received from the governments of Asia it says, "The statesmen of Asia are thus demonstrating that there is one white man they trust."

In a 1500-word front-page editorial in "Vaterland", the leading Catholic paper of Switzerland, the Chief Editor, Dr. Karl Wick, M.P., wrote, "Caux is Christianity in universal application. While the statesmen in London have been making efforts to solve the Suez crisis, Moral Re-Armament has been meeting for some weeks in Caux not to solve a specific political crisis by political and diplomatic means, but to come to grips with the solution of the basic problem of how the whole human race is to live together." In ten years Moral Re-Armament "can look back on astonishing successes".

A SUPERIOR IDEOLOGY

Dr. Otto von Huhn, recently returned from 11 years in Siberian prison camps:

Bolshevism is the natural fruit of our decadent Western spirit. In it God shows us our own reflection. One day God will open the doors and we must be ready to go through. The best preparation is to open to God the doors of our own hearts and learn to be obedient.

Mr. Willi Beredens, former Secretary for Training and Propaganda in the Lower Rhine area for the German Communist Party:

For the first time in the history of the Communist Party we were confronted with an ideological dilemma. We could easily deal with anti-Communism but here was a superior ideology that captured many of our best men.

THE STATESMEN

Dr. Fadhil Jamali, twice Prime Minister of Iraq, seven times Foreign Minister, Leader of his country's delegation to the United Nations:

Humanity must look to Caux for inspiration and guidance - not only individually, but nationally and internationally in all aspects of life. The future of humanity depends on whether the forces of construction as represented by Moral Re-Armament will conquer the world or not.

The United Nations needs teeth. These teeth are the spiritual standards for which Moral Re-Armament stands. The world situation will remain dangerous until we change human nature. Unless and until the statesmen of the world are ready to tear down barriers of selfishness, prejudice, dishonesty and local interest the United Nations cannot do much. No other international Assembly ever satisfied my needs and aspirations as Caux has done.

We need the Moral Re-Armament principles in the Middle East. With them you would not have had a Suez problem at all. Nasser has lost confidence in the Western statesmen and they have lost confidence in him. We must learn in the spirit of MRA to recognise our faults and apologise. We want these principles to prevail between the Arab world and the West. We must build confidence between Asia and Africa and Europe and America.

These last few days will have definite effect and influence on my conduct in the realm of politics.

The Tolon Na, Gold Coast Parliamentarian and administrative head of one-and-a-half million people, on the eve of the announcement of the proposed date of Gold Coast independence:

We have to choose now between our self-will and saving our countries and the whole world. A little act of carelessness in living and thinking at this stage can set the whole world blazing. A little act of God-guided thought can change the balance from defeat to unity. We must decide now or never.

General Ho Ying-chin, former Prime Minister of China and Commander-in-Chief of the 5 million men in the Chinese army at the end of the war:

MRA is the ideology the world badly needs. It has a common objective, an effective programme of action and a contingent of committed men and women. We cannot settle our many problems by force alone but through an ideology - through spiritual changes among ourselves. 600 million of my brethren are eagerly awaiting the message of Dr. Buchman on the Mainland.

Mr. R.A. de Leon, a founder and first President of the Guatemalan Christian Democratic Party, who officially represented Guatemala at the Mackinac Assembly:

Following the downfall of Communist materialism in my country we face even greater danger - the materialism of the Right which does not have the power to win Communists - the economic materialism that leads to the rebirth of Communism. To combat this materialism we need to find a spiritual and moral policy. Through Dr. Buchman humanity can be rebuilt on a new basis.

Dr. Matine Daftary, 2 years Prime Minister of Iran, former Foreign Minister and Minister of Justice:

When MRA penetrates society nationally and internationally it gives to justice a force more powerful than atomic energy.

Dr. Theodor Oberländer, German Federal Minister of Refugees:

There can be no lasting agreements between nations without ideological unity. The absolute standards of Moral Re-Armament must be the basis of political life and statesmen must listen to God if they want to fulfil their task.

Mr. Ole Björn Kraft, M.P., former Danish Foreign Minister and Chairman of NATO, 1952-53:

Moral Re-Armament has the answer that can bring to the West the moral and spiritual renaissance it so deeply needs. We must say goodbye to old nationalism and colonialism and find a new confidence among the nations.

(Speaking of his meeting with Mr. Hellwege on the question of the Danish minority in Germany):

Guidance can work in politics. We were together for four hours. On the basis of MRA - the four standards and guidance - we very easily found the basis of agreement between Denmark and Germany. Two days later Chancellor Adenauer invited our Prime Minister and Foreign Minister to come to Bonn. They found agreement.

Mr. James Dickson, M.P., and Chamberlain to H.M. the King of Sweden:

The time has come to win the very top political and commercial leaders. That is necessary to avoid serious trouble. The Suez question could be solved by any child in ten minutes if it were not for national pride, prestige, suspicion and the desire to dominate. After thirty years in politics with aims and goals that now seem meaningless I pray for time to make good. My first task now is to see that the Government and Parliament rule Sweden under God's guidance.

Mr. Urho Kähönen, M.P., Chairman of the Grand Committee of the Finnish Parliament:

Every politician who wants to be responsible must accept the absolute moral standards which are the pillars of MRA.

Senator Maurizio Vigiani, Secretary of the Christian Democratic Party of Florence:

I have heard at Caux the cry of a revolution on the march, of renaissance and the flame of faith. Our real problems are moral. Conferences, parliaments and laws will be useless if God does not change and renew humanity.

Professor Francesco Colitto, M.P., Leader of the Liberal Group in the Italian Parliament:

My country needs Moral Re-Armament. I want to take my full part in the reconstruction of the world.

Mr. Ludwig Kroll, M.P., German Federal Parliament:

Post-war Europe without Caux is inconceivable.

ASIA

"The time has come for the whole of Asia to accept Moral Re-Armament,"

Among the many representatives from Asia was a delegation of 35 from Japan, Korea, Australia and Papua who for the first time in history travelled together to a European conference.

Mr. Takasumi Mitsui, Chairman of the Mitsui Foundation, Japan:

We have come as a united Asian and Pacific force.

The first act of General Ho Ying-chin, who received the surrender of Japan at the end of the war, on his arrival at the World Assembly was to walk over, shake hands with and bow to the Japanese delegation which was waiting to welcome him.

Senator Takeshi Togano, Chairman of the Agricultural Committee of the Japanese Upper House:

We are fighting for the renaissance of Asia. We must apologise to Korea and the Philippines, but that is not enough. My decision is to make MRA the life and spirit of the Japanese Diet.

Mrs. Takeshi Togano, M.P., Member of the Foreign Affairs Committee of the Lower House:

Only a new type of statesman with conviction can solve the confusion of our time.

Mrs. H.S. Park, former Korean Cabinet Minister:

MRA is the answer for Korean economic, social and moral problems. Absolute moral standards will deliver the present and coming generations from catastrophe.

Mr. Shingi Sogo, Governor of the Japanese National Railways:

Thanks to the ideology of Moral Re-Armament, the idea that made people in Japan assume that our economic survival depended on expansion with colonies and battleships was brought to an end. I have committed myself to work for the rest of my life to serve MRA and all mankind. (He said that because of the rapid spread of Moral Re-Armament Japan has already achieved in two years many goals set by her five-year reconstruction plan.) We knew that Japan depends entirely on international trade and were filled with bitterness because we expected a boycott from other countries. I believe that because MRA has gone all over the world in such a short time and created such a generous atmosphere in the nations, the five-year plan is being achieved so quickly.

Mr. Teruma Nishiyama, Executive Member of the Japanese Chemical Workers Union:

What we need most in the trade union movement of Japan is the bitterness-free way of thinking of MRA.

Miss Kinu Wakamiya, Vice-Chairman of the 4,300,000-strong Japan Youth Federation attending the Assembly with four of the Federation's Directors:

Through MRA we have been able to upturn the direction of living and thinking of the Federation. It is MRA or Communism. I decided to come to Caux instead of going with a delegation of 50 youth to Peking. Caux is the hope of the youth of Europe and of the whole world.

Mr. Devadas Gandhi, Editor, "Hindusthan Times", son of the Mahatma:

If MRA fails, the world fails.

Mr. Rajaram Shastri, Indian Socialist M.P. and last year's General Secretary of the Socialist Trade Unions:

In the land of Mahatma Gandhi and Gautama Buddha, who fought for peace, I have fought the class war in the trade union movement for 25 years. I was mistaken. Here in Caux I have seen the classless society of my dreams. It can be established everywhere if we apply the absolute moral standards of MRA. I will apply these standards in my private and public life and in my trade union work whatever the consequences.

Mr. Ram Narayan Tripathi, Socialist Member of the Uttar Pradesh (pop. 66 million) Legislative Assembly:

Over the last 200 years we have had three great men - Sun Yat-sen from China, Mahatma Gandhi from India, and Dr. Frank Buchman from the West. I want to fight against the disunity and self-righteousness in my country by apologising for the bitterness and hatred we have had against the people from Ceylon.

Mr. Surya Sena O.B.E., son of the first Ceylonese to preside over the Ceylon Legislative Assembly.

I want on my part to ask forgiveness for the selfish attitude and self-interest of the Ceylonese people. I want to live to make India great.

Col. Krishnan Pandalai, founder and first President of the Surgeons' Association of India:

Caux and Mackinac are the two centres of the future world.

Mr. Thsetan Phunthsog, Editor from Ladakh, Western Tibet:

I have decided to translate and distribute the MRA literature at my own expense in Tibet and to dedicate my talents to furthering MRA for the benefit of the whole world.

NORTH AFRICA

Judge Andre Diligent, Secretary-General of the MRP (Christian Democratic) Party in the North of France, attending the Assembly with Mr. J. Wasmer, M.P., Vice-President of the MRP Parliamentary Group:

The Algerian problem will not be solved without Moral Re-Armament. I want you to pass on to all Algerians the apologies of one who has lived there for what has been done and needs forgiving. I am crushed by the sense of the responsibility my country has in this matter. I want to give myself to fill in the gap that divides us.

Mr. Augustin Gourlet, President of the Textile Employers of Lille:

It is with the hope of finding a just solution for Algeria that I decided to come to Caux. (to the Algerians) I must apologise. We were very proud of the material advantages we brought you but we forgot to bring the most important thing - our affection and our hearts. I know this solution depends on our change.

Mr. Mohammed Belhadi, a Member of the last Algerian Assembly and part of a strong nationalist delegation:

I place my full confidence in MRA to answer our problems. Thanks to MRA we have been liberated from every type of hatred and bitterness.

Mr. Robert Tilge, the representative of the employers of Northern France, many years in the forces in North Africa and the Middle East:

We owe you our apologies. We have been Christians who did not live our faith. A change of ownership of factory, flag or canal, institution or constitution, changes very little in the world today. The real hope lies in the change of men.

Mr. Mahmoud Bouzouzou, former editor of the largest Arabic paper in Algeria:

A Frenchman who has freed himself from the spirit of imperialism finds unity with an Algerian who has freed his heart from bitterness. We can build in Algeria the unity found in Caux and the Arab world can bring it to the whole world.

Mr. Alexandre Dubois, Head of the Bonpertuis Steelworks, France:

Let us be Frenchmen who are humble with their selfwill broken, ready to put right what is wrong instead of always putting forward justifications of what we have done that is good, ready to seek and to find not who is right but what is right. God will show us the way of reconciliation and we will find together a fruitful cooperation which will help the whole world to find a renaissance.

Mr. Braham Bouzar, Algerian nationalist:

MRA offers the last chance for a solution between Algeria and France.

Mr. Jean Noel, a French farmer in Tunisia, who had decided after being wounded in an ambush to leave the country:

I will work with the new leadership in Tunisia for the common good of all in North Africa. (He said that he had given concrete form to this decision by again investing his capital in the country, planting trees which will first bear fruit in 15 years time.)

Mr. Abdul Hamid ben Halim, brother of Libya's Prime Minister, speaking on his 21st birthday:

My father was in prison and my two uncles were shot in front of their wives but since meeting MRA I have found Italians who had changed. I want to apologise for the feelings of hatred which many Libyans have borne towards Italy. Together we can work in co-operation for the future.

Princess Castelbarco, stepping onto the platform to shake Mr. Halim's hand:

I am profoundly moved by what our young Libyan friend has said. For my part I apologise for the suffering Italy has caused.

Messages from Iran, Morocco and Burma

The Shah of Iran wished the Assembly "full success in the propagation of this inspired ideology among the men and nations of the whole world."

Hussein Ala, Prime Minister of Iran:

May Moral Re-Armament succeed. For by its sacrifices it deserves to win over the powers of darkness.

The Sultan of Morocco, officially receiving an MRA delegation at his Palace in Rabat:

We have complete confidence in the work which you are doing. My desire is that your message reached the masses of this country.

Hla Tun, Head of the new Karen State, Burma:

Our aim is new men, new nations, a new world.

AFRICA

African, Afrikaner, Coloured and English leaders from South Africa committed themselves together to fulfil Dr. Buchman's vision, "South Africa a sounding board for the nations".

Rev. Jotham Myusi, from New Brighton, scene of the most serious riots in recent South African history, speaking beside Mr. Jan Loubser, President of the Afrikaans-speaking students of South Africa:

I have preached peace and love from the pulpit but harboured deep-seated resentment and bitterness against the whites in my country, especially the Afrikaners. I want to take the first opportunity before the world to say to all South Africans I am deeply sorry. I go back to fight side by side with Africans, Indians, Afrikaners, Coloureds and English-speaking people for the rebuilding of my country and a new world.

Mr. Jan Loubser, President of the Afrikaanse Studente Bond (14,000 students):

I came to Europe to explain the South African situation but Caux came into my life as an answer. I have had a great concern for my country but I have seen that I was part and parcel of the problem and not the cure. I am responsible and guilty of every bit of dishonesty, selfishness, hate and impurity in my country. I want to apologise for that. The only restitution that I can make is to commit myself totally together with Coloured, African and English-speaking people in South Africa and with every race, colour and creed in the whole world to bring this answer to the whole world and to live this ideology every day in South Africa.

Mr. Pat Sonn, Member of the Central Executive of the Coloured People's National Union of South Africa:

I want to say how deeply sorry I am for my feelings towards the Afrikaners. We Coloured people want to fight with all to bring unity not only in South Africa but in the world. The answer lies with MRA.

Mr. Edward Raubenheimer, Member of the Central Executive of the Coloured People's National Union of South Africa:

We have always found fault with others. We have got to change and with MRA save South Africa and our people.

These two men gave specific evidence of how teamwork between the races on the basis of MRA had preserved many of the rights of the Coloured people.

Chief Sakwe, Chairman of the South African Council of Chiefs responsible for a million people in the Transkei:

MRA is giving new hope to my people and to the whole country by showing all races how to work together.

H.H. The Ewi of Ado Ekiti, Member of the Western Nigeria House of Chiefs:

MRA is the superior ideology which can unite the nations. I have decided to be part and parcel of this world force, to abolish my secret and hypocritical indulgences, to listen to God every morning and take His guidance to my people and to live to remake men.

Mr. T.A. Ajayi, Action Group Member of the Nigerian Federal House of Representatives for Ekiti, welcoming Mr. K.J.N. Okpokam, NCNC Member of the Eastern Nigeria House of Assembly:

Politics and tribalism have become almost synonymous. Election campaigns are used to fan the embers of tribal hatred. I am sorry for having taken part in this and am resolved to foster unity. Politics will not stop us becoming spiritually decadent. That is where MRA comes in. This is our opportunity.

Mr. R.J. Mehta, Vice-President of the Association of Chambers of Commerce and Industries, Eastern Africa:

We immigrant races have created a situation which we must help to mend. I want to apologise for the superiority which I have harboured towards all races. I have made a final decision come what may to live the absolute standards of Moral Re-Armament.

Lady Eleanor Cole, leading Kenya settler, whose uncle was Britain's Prime Minister, Lord Balfour:

We are going to make a fresh start. (Apologising for) arrogant superiority (towards other races, she said,) The only restitution I can make is to commit my life to bring an answer to Africa so that Africa can bring it to the world.

The Assembly was also attended by H.H. the Kyabazinga of Busoga, ruler of 600,000 in Uganda; H.H. Princess Irene, the Nalinya, sister of the Kabaka of Buganda; H.H. Princess Lucy of Bunyoro, representing the Omukama of Bunyoro and Mrs. Gertrude Mledle, President of the National Council of African women of South Africa.

THE NORDIC NORTH

All the Nordic peoples - from Greenland, Iceland, the Faroe Islands, Lapland, Finland, Norway, Sweden and Denmark were represented at Caux. From Finland came the Chairman of the Grand Committee of the Finnish Parliament, the leading artist Mr. Lennart Segerstråle, the former Speaker Professor Paavo Virkkunen, and national trade union leaders. Conservative and Socialist Members of the Swedish Parliament were present with an M.P. from Denmark representing Greenland, a Supreme Court Judge and the former Danish Foreign Minister. A delegation from Iceland included the representative of the Minister of Social Affairs. The premiere of a new play in Swedish was given at Caux by a cast including students from Uppsala University who have taken off a year from their studies to present this play throughout Scandinavia.

Mr. Abdel Taibi, Secretary of the Housing Workers of Casablanca, Morocco:

I intended to withdraw from the trade union movement and work for myself. Here I have found a new weapon of unity. I had decided to take revenge. Now I go back to apologise. (He said he had found at Caux an answer to the threat of insurrection.)

Mr. Amin Idris Hachim, founder member of the Moroccan Trade Unions (UMT) and Member of the Executive Committee:

Referred to the Sultan's invitation for Dr. Buchman to hold an assembly in Morocco and said, "We are fully behind His Majesty in wanting to see you there. I never thought Christian Europe could recall me to my basic principles. You have shown us the way of brotherhood. We will never lose the treasure we have found here."

Mr. Rao, the Indian docker's leader, said that the change brought by MRA meant "we have been able to negotiate the best possible agreement in our career and to create lasting peace in the industry." (Dockworkers earning three rupees a day contributed 1500 rupees towards his fare to Caux).

Mr. Carlo Rossi, a steelworker from Sesto San Giovanni, standing with his whole family on the platform, said, "The change in my brother, Luigi Rossi, made me think deeply, and when I saw an Italian worker who had been 21 years away from the Church, go with pail and water to clean out the Caux chapel, I thought, 'Go and scrub down your conscience. Why not go back to Confession and Communion?' I said, 'Yes', and after 15 years went back to the altar. There is a force in MRA to change people and I am grateful to Frank Buchman who has given us this superior ideology."

INDUSTRY

"The task of far-seeing responsible business leadership is not only to invest money but people in this answer. MRA gives sense, purpose and a destiny to industry in creating a new world."

Mr. Heinrich Hermann, Director of a Stuttgart paper firm

Mr. Hermann reported that his co-directors had unanimously decided to release him on full pay to travel with the force of Moral Re-Armament for an unlimited period.

Mr. von Velsen, Managing Director of the Ruhr Nordstern Mine, said, MRA has shown me how to take responsibility for a totally new thinking in the world. (It was at this Mine, from where the workers used to send annual greetings to the Soviet leaders, that management and labour joined in sending birthday greetings to Dr. Buchman.) It would not have been possible to reconstruct our mines, almost totally destroyed by the war, were it not for the new attitude I found through Moral Re-Armament. It meant for me to place my whole life and all my decisions under the guidance of God, accepting absolute moral standards.

Mr. Hans Hartung, shop steward responsible for the youth at Nordstern, added, When Mr. von Velsen took over our mine we rejected him and came out on strike. Today we stand together and we will never turn back.

Mr. Aad Stoop, President of the Board of Siemens Electrical Company, Holland:

I will give all the years that God gives me for this fight of Moral Re-Armament.

Mr. Oscar Sumelius, Finnish paper manufacturer:

We need the new type of businessman who makes the adequate decision of mobilising industry for the remaking of the world. I have decided to put all my resources into that mobilisation.

Mr. Matsuda, Managing Director of the Japan Employers' Federation, standing with seven front-line Japanese industrialists:

We who represent most of the big industries of Japan want to go back and apply the absolute moral standards of honesty, purity, unselfishness and love in our industrial life.

Mr. F. von Goumoens, President of the Swiss Viscosa Company:

We must give the world much more than goods. We have an indispensable share in the building of a new world.

Mr. Marcel Macaux, the General Manager of the Loire Steelworks, said that difficult negotiations found a simple solution in five minutes on the basis of what is right not who is right. "If we face self-interest and pride it is rare that we do not find a solution."

32 men and women from the Loire Steelworks factories in Dunkirk, Firminy and Lozerre - the General Manager, foremen and workers massed on the platform. The Chief Engineer, Mr. Nore, described the revolution which absolute honesty had brought about in himself, the General Manager and the factory. Since the advent of Moral Re-Armament 14,000 people had been guaranteed security of salary and against illness and accident. On his return from Caux the General Manager had immediately distributed company shares to the men according to length of service. The new spirit spread like "an electronic fire".

Mr. Robert Carmichael, President of the Jute Industry of France and Europe:

At the initiative of the Dutch we European industrialists have found unity born of commitment and sacrifice. We have decided in common to build a living organism for action everywhere in the world with all those in the world who will make the same commitment and to make use of this organism to fight for the unity of Europe and Africa.

THE CANTON AND CAUX

The President of the Grand Council of the Canton of Vaud, Mr. Berlie, speaking in the name of his colleagues from the Council who attended the Assembly, said, "We as people of the Canton of Vaud are proud that this centre of Caux lies in our Canton. We will retain a luminous memory of this day and we wish you every success."
