Musical Variety Show For City

SPRINGBOK STAMPEDE, the South African equivalent of the Moral Re-armament move-

ment, will give a musical variety show at the Conservatoire of Music, Jacob Maré Street, on Wednesday, January 8, at 8.15 p.m.

The cast of about 120 young men and women has been travelling the Republic and Rhodesia giving shows for the past 2½ years. They appeared four times on Rhodesian television and sang for the Prime Minister, Mr. Ian Smith. They have received excellent Press reviews in all the centres they have visited.

NO SALARY

The movement was started with the aims of developing leadership and establishing co-operation between South Africa and the rest of the continent. All the members of the movement work on a full-time basis without salary. Their ages range from 16 upwards.

Many members are still of school-going age and receive special tuition from qualified teachers who travel with them on tour.

The movement's finances are paid by money raised on tour and by public donations. The daily pocket money of the members is provided by family and friends.
