

Tycoon's son proposed to S.A. girl by cablegram

PRETORIA Saturday.

AN UNEXPECTED proposal by cablegram last year from a man with whom 22-year-old Charlotte Daneel worked in the United States will have its sequel in Pretoria next Saturday when she marries Mr. Anton Philips, 34, eldest son of Mr. Frits Philips, president of the Philips world-wide electronics organisation, in the Pretoria East Dutch Reformed Church. Miss Daneel is the daughter of the former rugby Springbok, George Daneel.

The ceremony will be performed by Ds. Daneel, who played as eighth man for the Springboks against the touring 1928 All Blacks, and toured Britain with the Springboks in 1931/32.

Mr. Philips Snr. will be guest of honour at the wedding. He will be accompanied by his wife, a son, Warner, and two married daughters, Mrs. Digna Hentzen and Mrs. Annejet Campbell.

The family will arrive in a French-built Dassault Mystere executive jet aircraft, and Mr. Philips, who will spend 10 days in South Africa, will meet the Prime Minister, Mr. B. J. Vorster, and Cabinet Ministers in Cape Town.

Worked in U.S.

Miss Daneel, born in Ermelo, matriculated at the Afrikaanse Hoërmeisieskool in Pretoria in 1961. She worked in London until 1964 and then left to work in the United States. She met and worked with Mr. Anton Philips in Los Angeles, on a Moral Re-armament magazine, Peace.

Mr. Philips is the grandson of another Anton Philips, who built a small lamp manufacturing company in Holland into the fourth largest electronics company in the world.

After their honeymoon the couple will settle in New York.
