NIGERIANS ENTERTAINED IN GERMANY

AFRICA today challenged the press men and film men of the world gathered in Berlin for the International Film Festival. Hundreds of journalists, radio men, photographers and film men from both sides of the iron curtain jostled and squeezed, jamming every space and making movement impossible, at a reception given for the press today by His Highness the Ewi of Ado Ekiti from Nigeria.

Loud applause met the direct words of the African leaders from the cast of "Freedom", in dazzling national costumes, as they gave a new direction to the Festival. From all sides came requests for interviews and stories featuring "Freedom".

"Let everybody take his part in this world-wide battle for freedom," declared His Highness the Ewi of Ado Ekiti, introducing His Highness, the Olowo of Owo, a Nigerian Cabinet Minister, and the other Africans. "Freedom' is our gift," he continued, "it is made of the passion and spirit of Africans and is played by Africans. We owe thanks to Dr. Buchman that a new age is opening up — a new understanding where colour is no longer a dividing but a

uniting thing. We are here to fight through this challenge with you."

One of the cast, Mr. Onumara Egwunwoke, General Secretary of the Nigerian Marine Floating Staffs Union, declared, "Freedom' leads to a new way in the film world. Films instead of just depicting moral decadence, must demonstrate an answer to it. Today is a turning point in the Festival because from now on we begin to live an idea to unite East and West".

Another of the cast, Dr. William Nkomo of South Africa, said, "This is an ideological film. Africans came to Caux, a training centre for Moral Re-Arma-ment, to look for a superior ideology. They found it in Moral Re-Armament. In 'Freedom' they are giving it to the world." — S15.
