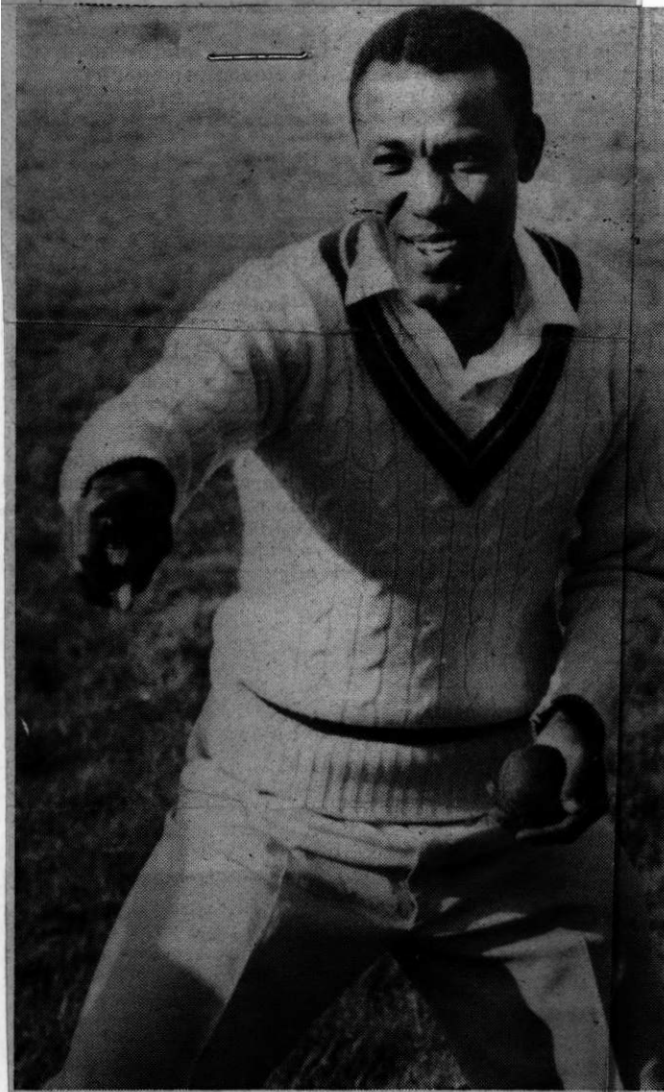

## Conrad Hunte in SA on Saturday

**CONRAD Hunte (left), the world-famous West Indian cricketer, the guest of honour at the Black Sports Star of the Year Banquet in Johannesburg on February 4, will be in South Africa on Saturday.**

The banquet, given annually by the Citrus Exchange to announce the Black Sports Star of the year, will be a lavish affair with the names of top sporting personalities heading the guest list.

An aggressive batsman, Hunte was vice-captain of the West Indies team during the sixties. It was largely due to his skill that they established themselves as "world champions" in 1964 and 1965.

In 1965 Hunte was awarded the Karl Nunes Trophy in Australia "for the player who has done most on and off the field to foster better relations between Australia and the West Indies."

He retired from cricket in 1967 and after writing his autobiography, "Playing to Win" he devoted himself to Moral Re-Armament.
