

# Enthusiasm of youth

**S**ELDOM in Johannesburg has a group of youngsters so positively captured the hearts of an audience, as the 48 students of the musical concert, "Springbok stampede," did last night.

The end of the performance saw three curtain calls, a five minute long standing ovation and community singing, as the A.T.K.V. hall trembled with the applause of the capacity 500 strong audience. One old man wept unashamedly as the curtains closed for the last time.
