Young force wanted to help M.R.A. in India

The grandson of Mahatma Gandhi, Rajmohan Gandhi, would welcome a force of young South Africans to help Indian Moral Re-Armament leaders, one of the directors of the movement in Britain said in Johannesburg today.

Mr. Roland Wilson, who has been on a tour of the Far East with his wife, told a meeting of about 100 women at the Automobile Club he had spoken to Gandhi last month and Gandhi had been enthusiastic about the possibility of a visit by young South Africans.

"They could become the talking point of the nation," he said.

Mr. Wilson said he had met Frank Buchman, the founder of the movement, at Oxford in 1929 when Buchman had said: "God has given me the conviction that South Africa is to be the sounding board of an answer for the whole world."

"In my view that truth still holds," Mr. Wilson said. "It was the first time I had thought of one nation called by God to pattern and pioneer a way of life that the whole world might want."
